## Canadian Society of Transplantation and CNTRP partner to launch the new CST-CNTRP Basic Research Catalyst Grant Competition

Ottawa, ON, April 27, 2018: The Canadian Society of Transplantation (CST) and the Canadian National Transplant Research Program (CNTRP) are pleased to announce the launch of a new Basic Science Transplant Research Grant Competition. The CST and CNTRP are providing up to \$100,000 to support peer-reviewed research that addresses basic science questions of relevance to the field of transplantation, with the ultimate goal of generating new knowledge that will improve long-term health outcomes and quality of life for Canadian transplant recipients. The primary focus of the Program is to support impactful basic science research projects related to solid organ transplantation.

"This opportunity will help the grant recipients to execute their ground-breaking basic research that will provide new knowledge ultimately improving patient outcomes," says Dr. Michael Mengel, President of the CST. "Basic science is the foundation of discovery for advancing our field and these operating grants are reflective of this. The CST provides support to the transplantation community through additional grants and awards and we are thrilled to add the CST-CNTRP Basic Research Catalyst Grant to the list."

"The CST is a founding partner of the CNTRP and has extensive member engagement across all CNTRP initiatives", says Dr. Lori West, Director of the CNTRP and Director of the Alberta Transplant Institute.
