

## TIER II CANADA RESEARCH CHAIR IN TRANSPLANTATION IMMUNOLOGY

The Faculty of Medicine at Dalhousie University is seeking to attract an individual eligible for nomination for a Tier 2 Canada Research Chair faculty position to join The Transplantation Research Program. The Chair's research focus will complement existing strengths at Dalhousie and would primarily be in the area of transplantation immunology. The successful candidate will be expected to continue to develop his or her own research and contribute to the developing research program in transplantation.

The Canada Research Chairs program was established by the Government of Canada to foster world-class centres of research excellence in a global, knowledge-based economy. The successful candidate will be offered a tenure stream appointment at the level of Assistant or Associate Professor in the Faculty of Medicine depending on current academic background. Dalhousie is a leading Canadian research-oriented University, located in Halifax on the scenic Atlantic coast of Nova Scotia. Transplantation is a recognized area of research focus for the Faculty of Medicine and the Capital District Health Authority.

The successful candidate will have an MD and/or PhD in immunology or closely related field, obtained within the last ten years, and a proven record of research excellence in immunology and/or inflammation. The current focus of the successful candidate's research need not necessarily be transplantation immunology but the Chair position comes with the responsibility to engage in research in transplantation immunology. This would mean that, over time, the successful applicant would shift their research focus to transplantation immunology, in collaboration with existing researchers in that field at Dalhousie. Other responsibilities will include participation in undergraduate and postgraduate education.
