Dear Canadian Transplant Summit participants,

The 2018 Canadian Transplant Summit takes place six months after Logan Boulet, Humboldt Bronco and organ donor, was taken off life support. His act of generosity spurred the single greatest collective act of giving this country has ever seen. In the weeks and months following his family's choice to share his story, over 100,000 Canadians registered their intent to donate.

The Canadian donation and transplant community is all too aware that this phenomenon is only part of the story. The availability of medical and surgical teams, operating room capacity, technical expertise, on-site family support, accurate matching and medical advancements are only some of the complex challenges that must be overcome every day. We look forward to hearing your ideas and being inspired by your enthusiasm over the course of the Canadian Transplant Summit.


