2016 CST Peds AGM Highlights

The pediatric group meeting at the CST annual conference in Quebec City was, once again, a wonderful way to highlight new pediatric investigators, learn more about emerging research to help our patients and network with child health colleagues. We were thrilled to welcome Dr. Kathryn Tinckam, a Transplant Nephrologist and Medical Director of the HLA Laboratory at the University Health Network, as our guest speaker. Dr. Tinckam shared her insights on HLA matching, eplet matching and adherence, and their effects on the emergence of DSA and graft loss in pediatric organ recipients. Her work and those of other Canadian researchers, including CST pediatric group members, will help guide our organ acceptance and allocation policies to ensure the best possible outcomes for pediatric recipients.

We were happy to award two trainees awards this year and hear from them about their work. Eberhard Lurz, from the Hospital for Sick Children, received the Clinical Science award for his project "A Multi-Centre Prospective Study of Frailty in Children with Liver Disease." Ibrahim Adam, from the University of Alberta, received the Basic Science award for his project "Anti-A immune response in mice to ABO-blood carbohydrates antigen is T cell dependent." We will be offering trainee awards again this year so please spread the word!

Our meeting also included revision of our terms of reference to allow more streamlined election procedures that can be facilitated over the summer months by electronic voting. We were also pleased to welcome three new executive group members, Jason Yap (Edmonton), Jenny Wichart (Calgary) and Yaron Avitzur (Toronto). Allied Health Travel Bursary



PURPOSE

Over the past several years, the most rapid growth in membership for the CST has been in the category of 'Associate Member', which includes allied health professionals. On-going initiatives have been made by the CST to encourage the involvement of Allied Health members. CST welcomes the active input of all members across the broad range of individuals with a professional interest in transplantation in clinical practice, research and education. The intent of the Pediatric Group Allied Health Travel Bursary is to help facilitate the attendance of allied health professionals at the Annual CST Pediatric Special Interest Group Annual Dinner and Business Meeting who might not otherwise have the opportunity or resources to attend.

PROCESS

Completion of an application form will be required to apply for the award. Up to three Allied Health Travel Bursaries (each \$1000 value) will be granted each year based on available funding to members of the CST Pediatric Group. Applications must be sent to the CST office. The deadline for applying is June 30, 2017. Preference will be given to those individuals who have not received travel awards within the last 3 years and who do not have other sources of funding. Award recipients are required to attend the CST Pediatric Group Annual Dinner and Business Meeting.

Trainee Research Award—Best Pediatric Transplant Abstracts

One of the missions of the CST Pediatric Group is to encourage trainee participation in clinical and basic science research in the field of pediatric transplantation.

Prizes Available

Up to 2 prizes will be awarded by the CST Pediatric Group for the best trainee pediatric abstracts submitted to the CST 2017 Annual Meeting.

Adjudication process

All abstracts will be reviewed and scored by the CST Pediatric Group Executive committee members and/or invited expert reviewers. Abstract reviewers will be blinded to the author's name. Abstract score from general CST meeting abstract review will be available to the pediatric award review committee. The committee will be asked to consider relevance to pediatrics and scientific merit and will score and rank each abstract according to a standard scoring strategy. A minimum acceptable score will be set in order for the abstract to be eligible for the prizes. The two top ranked abstracts (one in the basic science category and one in the clinical category) will be awarded \$1000 each. If there is no submitted abstract in the category that meets the minimum acceptable score, no prize will be awarded in that category.

Eligibility

- Eligible candidates are trainees in the field of pediatric transplantation, at the undergraduate, graduate or post-graduate levels. Medical students, medical and surgical residents and fellows, basic scientists in training, and allied health trainees are encouraged to apply.
- Applicants must be members of the CST (Trainee membership fee is \$50)
- Applicants' research supervisor must be a current member of the CST (though does not need to be a pediatric member)
- Abstract must have pediatric relevance

What will the Pediatric Trainee Research Awardee receive?

- Cheque for \$1000 CAD
- Complimentary registration for the Annual Meeting (Need to write to CST Administration to receive the registration, citing this award notice)
- Ticket for each of the evening Social Events (Need to write to CST Administration to receive the registration, citing this award notice)
- Acknowledgement at the Annual Meeting and Dinner of the CST Pediatric Group

What is expected of the Pediatric Trainee Research Awardee?

- Attendance at the following CST Pediatric Group Annual Dinner and Business Meeting of CST Pediatric group
- Presentation of your abstract at the CST Pediatric Group Annual Dinner and Business Meeting
- · Attendance at the CST Research FITs (Fellows-in-Training) Day, and participation in the CST annual meeting and conference
